

L. I. SCHOOL TO MUTE EAST GERMAN HORNS

EAST MEADOW, L. I., Nov. 5 —The hottest horn here today is a B-flat trumpet bearing the notation "Made in Germany, U. S. S. R. Occupied Zone."

Discovery of the inscription by Sidney Lukas of Westbury has resulted in the recall of all instruments rented to music pupils in the Bowling Green School. Each instrument will be given a "loyalty" check. Those found to have come from behind the Iron Curtain will be banished.

The trumpet had been rented to Mr. Lukas' 10-year-old son, Frederick, by the Terminal Music Instrument Supply Company of Manhattan, one of four firms supplying instruments to music pupils. The youngster, a fifth grade pupil, paid \$15 rental for one year, his father said.

Edward Meyers, the supply company manager, said he didn't know where the instrument was manufactured. "We needed about ten horns in a hurry, and just called our importer," he explained.

Mr. Lukas, himself a former musician, said he had inspected the trumpet when his son brought it home a week ago. He could find no brand name, but, on using a magnifying glass, discovered the tell-tale inscription.
